Keeping Our Community Healthy

Protecting Against COVID-19—Unfortunately, COVID-19 cases have increased rapidly in the US and even within our own County. Given this, we now have new local and state mask mandates. The Delta variant has quickly become the dominate strain in the US; it appears to be much more contagious than previous variants. There have been some breakthrough cases with those who are vaccinated. The good news is that breakthrough cases are a small percentage of the overall cases and most of these lead to mild illness. The best ways to protect yourself from serious illness are to get vaccinated, avoid large crowds, and mask up when in indoor public spaces or crowded outdoor areas. If you do suspect you have COVID-19, avoid contact with others and contact your medical provider ASAP. Immunocompromised individuals interested in discussing their need for a third dose of vaccine should review their situation with their primary healthcare provider or clinical staff at their medical home. Your primary care providers can help arrange for you to receive the vaccine, if appropriate.

As per recent Federal guidance, San Juan County is working with local healthcare providers and pharmacies to discuss plans to supply booster shots starting this fall. Once finalized, those plans will be well publicized and widely shared in the community.

Flu Vaccination Clinics—Just a reminder that it is also a good idea to get an annual flu vaccination. Lopez Island Pharmacy and San Juan County flu shot clinics should be happening in late October/early November; announcements will be made in the October newsletter, in local media outlets, and on the County website and H&CS Facebook page. You can also consult your medical provider. The best time to get your flu vaccine is in late October or early November in order to ensure adequate protection throughout the upcoming flu season.

Respite Care

A reminder to those of you who are unpaid care givers of a friend or family member. Respite care is available for up to 13 days a month at Hamlet House in Lopez Village if space is available, or on the mainland. The rate paid is based on the monthly income of the person receiving care. It is a sliding scale, and Northwest Regional Council pays the difference from the Respite grant they receive from the State of Washington. This program allows the caregiver to have a break from caregiving, which is necessary for them to remain in good emotional and physical health. Meal Service - Lunch

Home Delivered Meals only at this time. Wednesdays and Fridays. \$5 suggested donation for seniors 60 and over, \$7 for those under 60. Home delivered meals to homebound seniors on lunch days. Delivery time depends on the number of persons on the route that day.

Great news from the July Board of Directors meeting. The San Juan Islands Shuttle System's Board is

now being served by representatives on all three main islands in the county: Barbara Schultheiss, Curt VanHyning and Roni Becker Wilkie on Lopez, Erin O'Dell and Bruce Benton on Orcas, and Sandi Ugrin, Bob Barnhart and Debbie Haagensen on San Juan Island. These volunteers are serving so that our county's island residents receive the transportation access they deserve to local, on-island goods and services.

To help address this objective, once in-person community meals can safely resume at the senior centers, IslandRides drivers will prioritize ride requests to and from these weekly meals. This will remove some of the transportation pressure from the Meals on Wheels drivers and staff who are now facilitating a much higher volume of home delivered meals. Getting seniors to/from the senior centers to participate in social programs and services, including community lunches, is a service that IslandRides is happy to facilitate so don't hesitate to call us if you need transportation to your local center for a foot care appointment, meeting, special event, or for lunches once they resume. Also, don't forget we also do grocery and drug store deliveries if you need assistance.

As demand for personal, door-to-door transportation increases, more volunteer drivers are needed on all three islands. If you are able to commit to a fourhour shift weekly, driving folks on island to shopping or medical appointments, we need your help. About the San Juan County Senior Nutrition Program

The San Juan County Senior Nutrition Program provides home delivered "Meals on Wheels" and Senior Community Meals (currently on hold due to the pandemic) to older adults on Lopez, Orcas, and San Juan Islands. The Meals on Wheels and More program is administered by the non-profit Whatcom Council on Aging in partnership with San Juan County Health and Community Services and the senior centers on Lopez, Orcas, and San Juan, which operate under the umbrella of the Senior Services Council of San Juan County 501(c)(3). The program is partially funded through federal grants, San Juan County levy funding, senior center in-kind contributions (utilities, fuel, kitchen equipment, etc.), and by client donations. The program also relies heavily on private donations and fundraising.

I come home socially fulfilled.



Aging with Pride: IDEA

IDEA = Innovations in Dementia Empowerment and Action

Free Program for Adults with Memory Loss and Their Care Partners

Aging with Pride: IDEA (Innovations in Dementia Empowerment and Action) at the University of Washington is offering a free program for the LGBTQ community. Aging with Pride: IDEA is the first federally-funded research study examining ways to improve the health and quality of life for adults with memory loss and their caregivers in the LGBTQ community. LGBTQ adults with memory loss and other cognitive challenges face significant barriers to healthcare access. Caregiving of LGBTQ older adults with memory loss is of concern due to social stigma, marginalization and social isolation, which can be barriers to sustaining caregiving.

The person with memory loss and their caregiver participate as a pair and at least one of them must be LGBTQ. The caregiver can be a spouse, partner, adult child, relative, friend, or anyone who helps the person with memory loss. The person with memory loss must be 50 years or older.

The IDEA program includes nine individualized sessions with a trained coach who teaches the pair problem-solving skills to improve behavioral challenges and communication. A low-impact exercise program is also included in the sessions. The sessions are individualized and virtual, using easy video chatting. Participants are compensated for completing phone interviews.
